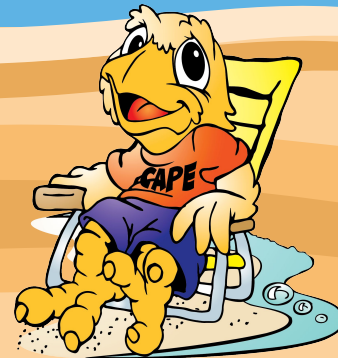

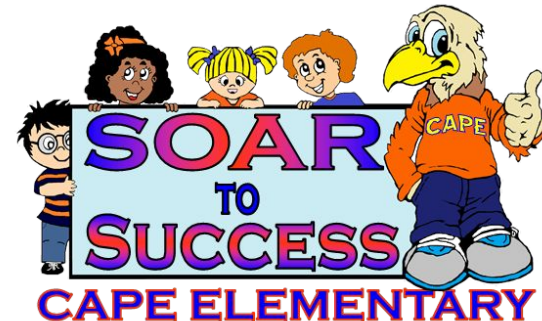

SAFETY



- Single Point Entry with video surveillance
- 104 cameras around campus
- Officer Ed Schilff (CCPD) on our campus each day
 - Replacement SRO is sent when he's off campus
- All Doors and gates are kept locked and checked routinely
- OPENGATE weapons detection system which is designed for the automatic screening of students, staff, and visitors who enter onto campus during school hours for Threat Detection
 - Secondary search is conducted if needed
- All visitors
 - Must enter through the main office entrance
 - Must bring photo identification to all events
- All volunteers
 - Background checks are completed

SAFETY

- District and Cape Elementary safety plans are continuously evolving and changing to address different and various situations that could occur.
- Monthly drills- fire evacuation, full lockdown and severe weather
 - Students and staff are familiar with procedures and protocols
- Maintain close relationship with local law enforcement
 - Play a part in monitoring our schools to make certain that our security cannot be breached.
 - Help us do walk-throughs of our buildings and provide feedback of what we are doing well and areas where we might need improvement
- School Messenger to communicate to parents during an emergency
 - Please make sure that your contact information is up to date so you receive these notifications

Threat Assessment

The School District of Lee County is continuing to take steps to protect our children and employees from threats of violence in our schools.

- What happens after a report is made?
 - Notification of a threat
 - People with concerns should notify the threat assessment team, school administrators or teachers, or law enforcement about the nature of the concerns
- Information Gathering
 - Next, the team gathers more information about the subject of concern.
- Analysis of Information
 - Next the team analyzes information gathered through the threat assessment process.
- Assessing the Threat
 - Next the team analyzes information gathered through the threat assessment process.
- Make the Assessment
 - Once the team has answered the above questions (recognizing that a team may not be able to obtain information regarding all of the questions) and have documented its findings, the team then assesses the threat posed by the individual by answering the following:
 - Does the person pose a threat of targeted violence at school?
 - Is the person's behavior consistent with movement on a pathway toward violence?
 - Does the person's current situation and setting incline him or her toward or away from targeted violence?

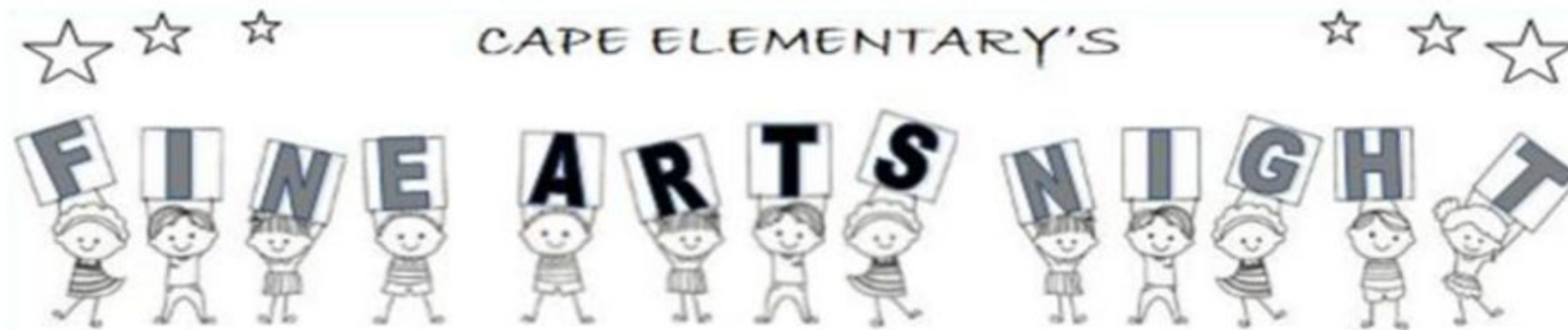
Threat Assessment Team

- Threat assessment team includes: School Administrator; and all mental health professionals, including, the School Counselor, School Psychologist, School Social Worker, and the School Resource Officer, each with different roles for supporting the assessment and intervention process.
- The threat assessment team determines if
 - **Transient Threats**- if the threat is easily and readily resolved. Examples of transient threats are jokes or statements made in anger that are expressions of feeling or figures of speech rather than expressions of a genuine intent to harm someone.
 - **Substantive Threats**- always require protective action to prevent the threat from being carried out, such as notification. In response to very serious substantive threats, the threat assessment team takes additional safety precautions, including a referral for a mental health evaluation.
- For both transient and substantive threats, there is an emphasis on helping students to resolve conflicts.

President's Report- What has the PTO been up to lately?

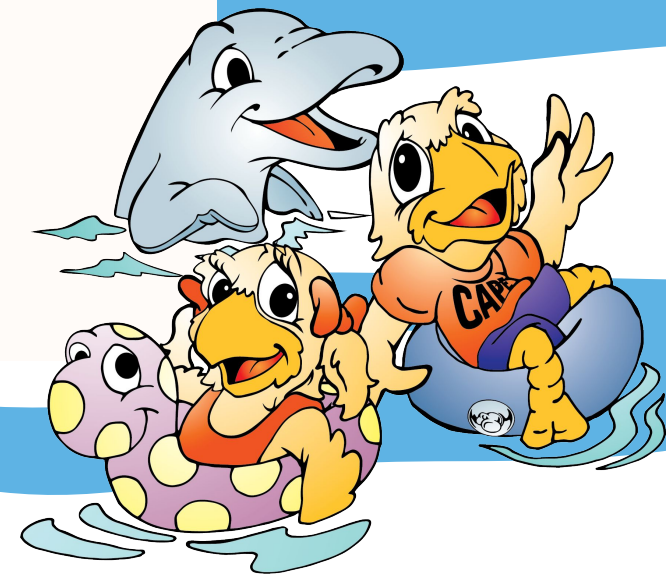
- Free Breakfast with Santa – largest ever with over 500 attending

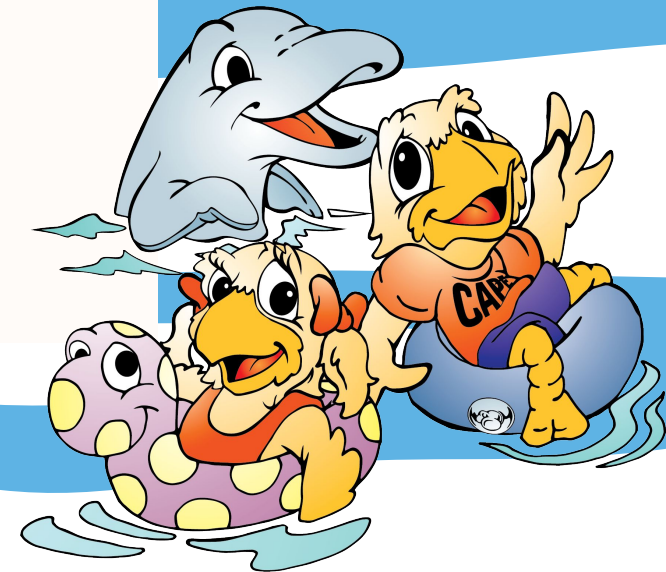

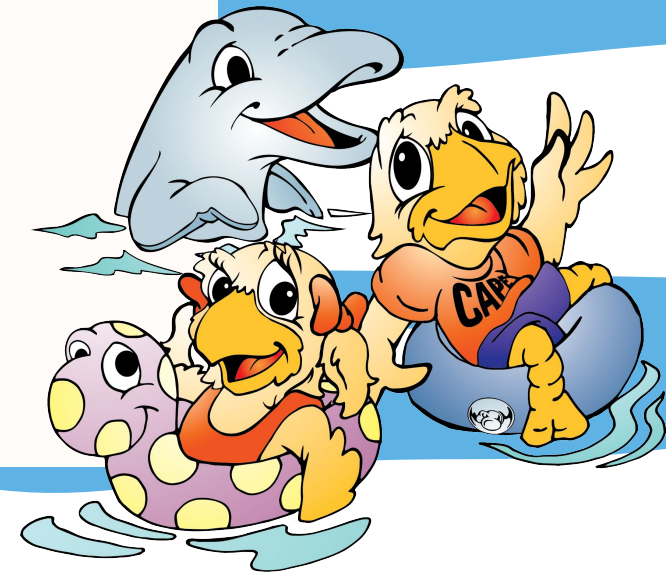
