# School Improvement Goals

- Cape Elementary second grade students will increase their ELA Achievement from 73% proficient to 78% proficient as measured by Spring 2024 FAST Assessment.
- Cape Elementary will increase ELA proficiency from 61% to 65% as measured by Spring 2024 ELA FAST.
- SWD subgroup will increase ELA proficiency from 34% to 42% as measured by EOY 2024 FAST Assessment.



# Weapons Detection System



- To enhance the safety and security of our campus, we will start using the OPENGATE weapons detection system.
- OPENGATE is designed for the automatic screening of people with backpacks and bags for Threat Detection. It will also identify other contraband items that are not allowed on school property.
- All students and all visitors will be subject to search as they enter campus during regular school hours. If OPENGATE detects any contraband items that are not allowed, a secondary search will be conducted.
- Contraband discovered during the secondary search will be confiscated and could lead to school discipline and/or legal consequences.
- Students should prepare to pass through the OPENGATE system by removing their Chromebooks from their backpacks.
  - Cape will start sending chromebooks home in November.

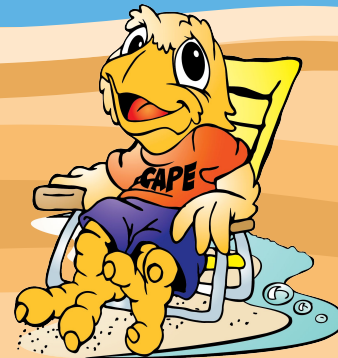
## Curriculum Night

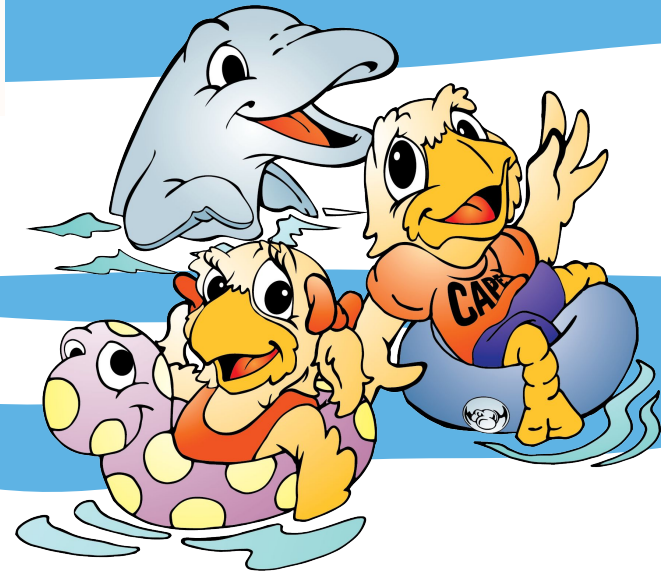

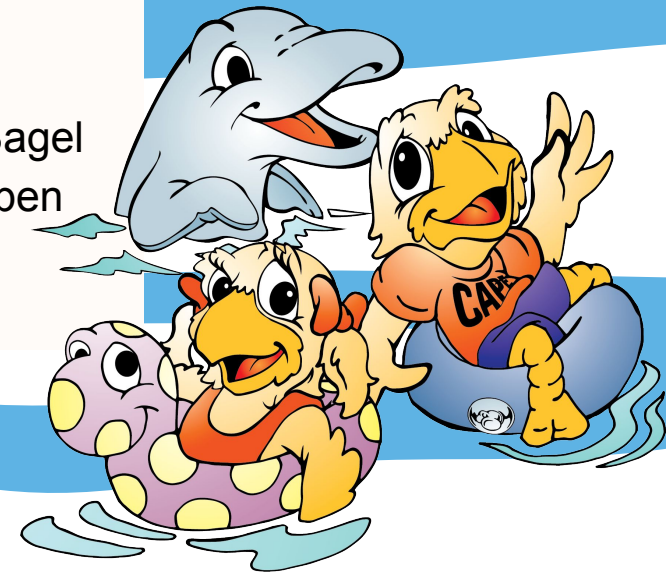

- Kicked off our Fall Fundraiser – Paper orders were due 9/12 – Online Sales open until 9/18

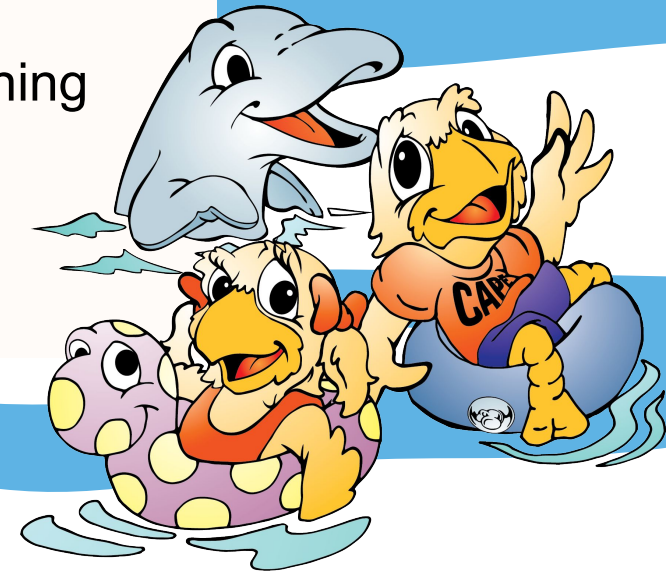

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Field Trip Bus \$300

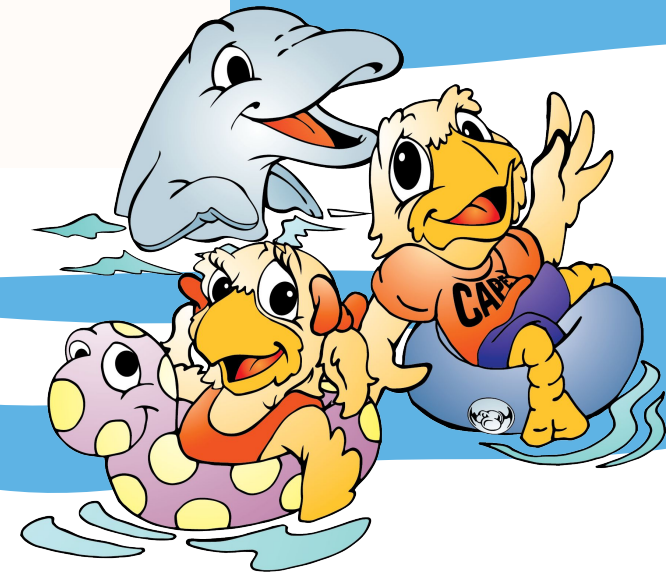
